- Sophomore status or higher (preference given to juniors)
- For internship, LSBU courses or QMUL courses: 3.0 GPA

HAL Semester-Length

- Fall and Spring semesters
 - Three different course options:
 - 4 Hollins Courses (16 credits)
 - 3 Hollins Courses (12 credits) + London South Bank University (LSBU) **or** Queen Mary University of London (QMUL) course (3 credits)
 - 2 Hollins Courses (8 credits) + Internship (6 credits)
 - **Theatre Track – Fall only**
- Other Program Features
 - Full-time on-site director
 - Assistance at airport upon arrival
 - Four-day on-site orientation program with excursions
 - Two group weekend excursions, within Britain and one to mainland Europe (included in the program fee)
 - Membership in University of London Student Union (including facilities and club activities)

- Seven-week internship as part of the complete experiential learning program

Location: Florida State University (FSU) London Study Center



Located a few minutes from the Study Centre lies not only the West End, the major theatre district of London, but [Trafalgar Square](#), [Piccadilly Circus](#), the [National Gallery](#), and opera and ballet theatres. The esteemed [British Museum](#) is only one block away. In addition to Hollins office and classroom space, The Study Centre offers students a fully working [library and three computer labs](#), operated by a professional librarian, IT, and library assistants.

Housing

- Students choose to live with British hosts or in a student residence hall.
 - Most students choose to live with British hosts, which gives the students the opportunity to experience British culture and British perspectives on political and social issues.
 - Students who live with British hosts have their own house keys and are treated as independent adults.
 - Homestays are in the residential areas of northern London with convenient connections on public transportation to FSU Study Center.

This website facilitates the advising and application process for **Hollins students** who want to study abroad on any of our program offerings, as well as **external candidates** (of any gender) who wish to study abroad on our London semester or London Summer Internship programs. The website is hosted by Terra Dotta (aka Studio Abroad), which is why you may hear it referenced as such.

Hollins University currently runs its own program in **London (including the London Summer Internship program)**, and **any student** may apply to attend for a semester. To explore those programs, please click on the link for each of those programs, which appears in the column to the left.

Hollins University students may also apply to a number of **affiliated and faculty-led programs***. Links to the brochure pages for each of those programs can be found by clicking on "List of Programs (for Hollins Students)" in the column to the left. (*Not all faculty-led trips will appear on this site. Please consult the registrar's course listings for a full list of faculty-led trips and contact the professor leading the trip directly for instructions on how to apply.)

Each program has a "**Brochure Page**" which will contain all the details regarding the program you are considering. When you click "**Apply Now**" from the Brochure page for each program, you will first be directed to create an account and enter some basic information. Be sure to designate which school you are from. You will then be able to apply for the program you want to attend (if we are currently accepting applications). **For complete directions on the application process**, please click on "Start Here" in the column to your left, and then "How to Apply," which will appear underneath.

FOR HOLLINS ABROAD AND HOLLINS-AFFILIATED PROGRAMS

All Hollins financial aid (except work-study) that you receive for study at Hollins can be applied to any Hollins study abroad program for one or two terms (depending on the program). In a few cases, special application procedures apply. There are also several Hollins scholarships designated specifically for study abroad.

The **Switzer Wise**, **Louise King Tower**, **Stuart Degginger**, **Myles Abroad**, and **Mary Rowland Sowell Abroad Scholarships** are awarded to abroaders eligible for need-based financial aid. The funds replace work-study earnings and may also increase a student's total grant amount. Please make an appointment with Scholarships and Financial Assistance to discuss your options.

The **International Travel Awards (for Semester & Year Long Programs)** are awarded to one or more abroaders based on academic merit with preference given to students with financial need. Both provide funds to cover expenses for study abroad not covered by the comprehensive fee, e.g., airfare, optional tickets and trips, etc.

The **Anne Gregory Paris Fellowship** is awarded to one or more Hollins Abroad-Paris students based on academic merit and commitment to the study of French language and culture. Preference is given to students with financial need. This fellowship helps cover expenses not included in the comprehensive fee (airfare, theatre tickets, culinary arts course, independent cultural travel, etc.)

The **Marguerite Prinnet Scholarship** is awarded to one or more Hollins Abroad-Paris students majoring in studio art or art history based on academic merit with preference given to students with financial need. It helps cover expenses that are not included in the comprehensive fee (airfare, theatre and concert tickets, cultural excursions within France.)

FOR SHORT TERM OVERSEAS PROGRAMS (J-TERM, SPRING BREAK, SUMMER)

International Travel & Scholar Awards (JTerm/SpringBreak) are awarded to one or more students pursuing an overseas academic program or course during J-term as well as the Jamaica Service Project during spring break. Based on academic merit with preference given to students with financial need.

Note: Travel awards are also available for our London Summer Internship Program, and the application for funding for that program is built into the program application so that students attending that program will receive earlier notification.

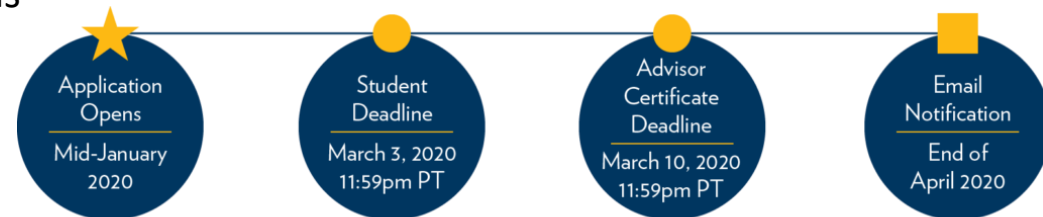
Gilman Scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements

- Available for Pell recipients and Pell-eligible students
- U.S. citizenship
- Program of choice must be at least three weeks (21 days) long
 - Nearly all short-term programs offered by Hollins meet this requirement

Application Process

- Two essays:
 - Statement of Purpose
 - Community Impact (Service Project)
- Previous recipients have received up to \$4,500 for their semester-length programs



Eligible Programs: Overseas programs that start between May 2020 and April 2021

Terms Accommodated: Summer 2020, Fall 2020, Academic Year 2020-2021, Winter 2021, Spring 2021

UPCOMING DEADLINES

You must complete all post-decision requirements, though not all at the same time.

Application Questionnaires

Flight Itinerary – due May 1st

You must submit your flight itinerary
(all connections included)
before the end of the semester.

Material Submissions

Proposed Course List - due May 1st

The proposed course list is a document used by the International Programs office to keep track of the courses you've enrolled in at your host institution.

Hollins Abroad – London students will only need to complete this form if they are taking a course at QMUL or LSBU

Visa Appointment Scheduling Confirmation – due June 1st

Only students participating in the Paris programs will need to upload their visa confirmation once it has been made.

Signature Documents

UK/Paris Visa Process and Instructions – due May 1st

You will need to have reviewed our guidance for the visa application process by this date.
